

**Addendum NO. 1**

This Addendum ("addendum") effective as of December 3, 2020 ("Effective Date") between The Standards Institution of Israel ("SII") and the UL Contracting Parties ("UL") is made pursuant to the Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") dated September 2, 2013 between SII and UL. Any capitalized term in this Addendum shall have the same meaning as the MOU.

The parties agree to amend the MOU as follows:

**Section I – GENERAL TERMS:**

This addendum is subject to all of the terms of the MOU. However, if a provision of this addendum specifically references a provision in the MOU and provides that the provision of this Addendum shall control in the event of a conflict, then such provision in this addendum shall control with respect to the work under this addendum.

**Section II – Changes or Additions**

Appendix A (including its Annex 1) of the MOU is deleted in its entirety and replaced with the attached Appendix A:


All other terms of the MOU shall remain unchanged and in full force and effect.



**APPENDIX A  
to MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING**

**Between UL Contracting Parties and  
The Standards Institution of Israel**

SII and UL independently will offer conformity assessment and certification services for the product categories/standards set forth below, subject to all the terms in the agreement including DAP requirements:

Based on the above-mentioned services, both parties will, within the framework of its authority, issue its own Certificate. In Israel, the issuing of a Certificate shall also include the necessary approval for release from customs. SII and UL will accept test reports without requiring test samples.

Both parties have the right within the framework of its own quality assurance system to carry out additional follow up tests on products tested by the other party.

The scope includes all the standards under the CB scheme for each category; however the scope can be extended or reduced subject to further written agreement between the Parties, including ad hoc agreement by letter or telefax.

In addition to the CB scheme reports above, test reports issued by UL laboratories according to the EN/IEC standards in Annex 2 are recognized by SII to cover the requirements of Israeli Energy Resources, Automotive and Gas Regulations.

#### ANNEX 1

##### Testing of Toys

1. The relevant Standards are European series of Standards EN71 (Safety of Toys) as well as EN 62115:2005 for the Electrical Safety of Toys.
2. UL labs will have a valid accreditation certificate that was issued by an accreditation body that is a member of the International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation (hereinafter referred to as: "ILAC") in order to perform the toys tests.
3. UL Labs Test Reports and relevant documents shall be submitted to SII by Israeli importers. (Submission by UL parties is also permitted).
4. UL will appoint a professional representative for the toys field to provide data
